NEW REPORTS:

- 1A - Action Required
- 1B - Awaiting Response

OLD REPORTS:

- 2A - Action Required
- 2B - Awaiting Response

ANALYTICAL EVALUATION STATUS:

- 3A - Written eval required -- (Uncorrelated findings)
- 3B - Written eval required -- (Correlated findings)
- 3C - Eval Submitted for Management Review (Uncorrelated findings)
- 3D - Eval Submitted for Management Review (Correlated findings)
- 3F - Written eval required -- False report
- 3G - Written eval required -- Tentatively false
- 3T - Written eval required -- Tentative correlation

MANAGEMENT REVIEW & APPROVAL OF CATEGORIES:

- ④ - This category represents an unresolved status. The analytical evaluation has been reviewed and approved by senior level management -- no correlation or further action is possible.
- ⑤ - This category is used only by managerial personnel and indicates difficulties exist in follow-up. (Note: This category represents an unresolved status and is used only in rare occasions; it is not a permanent category assignment.)
- ⑥ - This category shows analytical evaluations reviewed and approved by Senior level management which have been correlated to a known individual or incident.
- ⑥B - Analytical evaluations reviewed and approved by management which are determined to describe an unidentified individual who is not an American PW-MIA. This indicates correlations to a NON-PW; however, using this category does not resolve the case.
- ⑦ - This represents Camp Information Only. The specific camp data is outlined in field S_SOURCE.
- ⑧ - This represents NO PW-MIA INFORMATION. At any time, the management can place a case in this category; however, field TYPE_INFO (type of sighting) should be amended appropriately.
- ⑨ - This category indicates the analytical evaluation is approved as a fabrication.
- ⑨B - This category indicates the analytical findings are approved by management as a possible fabrication.

Technicians adding new records normally use status 1A and 7. The additional categories are used at the time a record is boarded. Statistically speaking the following will outline which categories are resolved and which ones are unresolved.

RESOLVED:

3B, 3D, 3F, 3G, 3T, 6, 9, and 9B are resolved--Some of these cases may need official evaluations; however, they are computed as resolved cases within the statistics.
